rvington declared an Emergency and Your Way Construction, General Construction and Site Work, located at 404 Coit Street, Irvington, NJ 07111 had the necessary equipments available immediately to perform the work on an emergency basis, and;

WHEREAS, the total cost to rent the required equipments to complete the work was \$10,810.00 for January 22, 2014; \$7,620.00 for February 03, 2014 and \$8,000.00 for February 05, 2014, totaling \$26,430.00 and;

AN ORDINANCE ELIMINATING LONGEVITY PAYMENTS FOR MANAGERIAL AND NON-UNION PERSONNEL HIRED AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND FREEZING LONGEVITY PAYMENTS FOR EXISTING MANAGERIAL AND NON-UNION PERSONNEL, EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 2013.

WHEREAS, the Township of Irvington provided longevity payment in addition to the salaries of officers and employees, other than the governing body and part-time employees (exclusive of police and fire personnel below the rank of Police Chief and Fire Chief or Director) by way of Chapter 44 Section 44-5 the Ordinance of the Township of Irvington; and

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to freeze such longevity payments at existing levels for current employees and eliminate longevity pay for all non-union managerial level employees who commenced employment on or after December 31, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Township's Municipal Council has determined that it is a best practice to eliminate such employee incentives for managerial and non-union employees; and

WHEREAS the Township believes it is in the interest of the taxpayers of the Township of Irvington to eliminate longevity pay for managerial and non-union employees who commenced employment on or after December 31, 2013.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the Township of Irvington, County of Essex; State of New Jersey as follows: Township Code Section 44-5 "Salaries and Compensation" shall be amended to read as follows:

§ 44-5. Longevity pay.

Managerial and non-union employees shall not be entitled to receive longevity pay. Any payments previously designated or due as longevity, have already been included in the administrative officer's salary.

SEVERABILITY. If any Section, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or state agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. Ordinances, resolutions, and regulations or parts of ordinances, resolutions, and regulations inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

EFFECTIVE DATE. The Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE IRVINGTON GREEN TEAM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Mayor' Committee for a Green Future of the New Jersey League of Municipalities has promulgated and publishes a municipal certification program and organization called ("Sustainable Jersey "); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of Sustainable Jersey is to enlist municipalities in a concerted and organized state-wide effort to improve the environment and promote sustainability; and;

WHEREAS, the Township desires to establish the Irvington Green Team as a permanent advisory committee of the Township of Irvington ("Township").

NOW, THEREOF BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Irvington, County of Essex, State of New Jersey as follows:

FIRST: Establishment:

The Irvington Green Team be and is hereby established as an advisory committee to the Irvington Township Committee.

### SECOND: Purpose:

The General purposes for the Green Team shall include but not be limited to:

(a) Managing Irvington's participation in the Sustainable Jersey program;

(b) Encouraging the Township staff to pursue sustainable practices where

possible and implement the Township Committee's environmental goals;

(c) At the recommendation of the Township Committee, work with the existing groups within the Township whose actions effect environmental issues so as to eliminate duplication and assure that important tasks are covered;

(d) Provide suggestions for further research and action to the Township Council;

(e) At the direction of the Township Committee, provide advice and suggestions to the Township Planning Board, the Township Board of adjustment and the Township Historic Preservation Commission to assure that environmental issues are considered in their deliberations and actions;

(f) Manage and organize various ad hoc environmental groups within the Township;

(g) Solicit and evaluate environmental ideas and suggestions from the community;

(h) Promote the causes of sustainability within the Township.

THIRD: Membership, Term of Office:

The Irvington Township Committee shall appoint seven (7) members to serve as the Green Team. The Green Team shall elect from among its members a Chair, Vice Chair and secretary/Treasurer. Initially, three (3) members shall be appointed to a three (3) year term, two (2) members to a two (2) year term and two (2) members to a one (1) year term.

Thereafter, all terms shall be for three (3) years. Additionally, a member of the Township Committee and the Township Administrator shall serve as ex officio members of the Green Team. Ex officio members shall not vote.

The Green Team shall select Township volunteers to work on Green Team projects. The names of the Green Team volunteers shall periodically be submitted to the Township Council and the Green Team committee reports, minutes, etc. shall also be submitted to the Township Council.

FOURTH: Meetings:

The Green Team shall meet monthly.

Additional meetings of Green Team may be scheduled by the Chair at his/her discretion.

#### FIFTH Severability:

If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the specific section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause pr provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SIXTH: Repeal of Prior Ordinances

Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistencies. SEVENTH Effective Date:

This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

WHEREAS, Rev. Harris shares his life and ministry with his wife, Ellen Michelle in a marriage framed in friendship; faith and love since they both grew up in the same neighborhood and in ministry together beginning in East Orange and Peaceful Zion with Michelle being a gifted attorney and the Chief Legal Officer for the Newark Housing Authority; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Harris and Sis. Harris happily call Newark their home and are pleased that they live close to the church and the people they are called to serve:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SERVICE CONTRACT FOR REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING

WHEREAS, resolution number DPW 13-0611-15 appointed six Licensed Site Remediation Professional (LSRP) to complete projects for the Township of Irvington from July 01, 2013 until June 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the resolution requires that quotes be obtained from all six vendors for all projects and the vendor that submits the lowest quote will be awarded the contract; and

WHEREAS, resolution number DPW 13-1022-34 awarded a contract to CME Associates after the company provided the lowest quote to complete a New Jersey Department Environmental Protection (NJDEP) violation report; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP violation report discovered that additional work is required to be completed to prevent the Township from being sued and fined; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of complete the required work is \$50,556.00; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has recommended that a contract be awarded to CME Associates, 3141 Bordentown Ave, Parlin, NJ 07719 to complete the required work.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF IRVINGTON that a contract for site remedial investigation and other related work be awarded to CME Associates, 3141 Bordentown Ave, Parlin, NJ 07719 for an amount not to exceed \$50,556.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Attorney is hereby authorized and directed to prepare the necessary contract extension and the Mayor and Township Clerk are authorized and directed to sign the same; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the required Certification of Availability of Funds in the amount not to exceed \$50,556.00 for site investigation will be obtained from the Chief Financial Officer contingent on the adoption of the Calendar Year 2014 budget.
