RESOLUTION TO AWARD AN EMERGENCY CONTRACT FOR SNOW REMOVAL TO YOUR WAY CONSTRUCTION, GENERAL CONSTRUCTION AND SITE WORK

WHEREAS, on February 13, 15, 18 and 20 2014, the total accumulated snow fall created a hazardous blizzard condition, and;

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works employees were unable to remove all the accumulated snow from streets and other public properties in a timely manner, and;

WHEREAS, additional heavy duty equipment and personnel were needed to remove the accumulated snow to avoid a public safety emergency, and;

WHEREAS, the Mayor/the Acting Neighborhood Service Director declared an emergency and authorized the hiring of a general contractor, and;

WHEREAS, Your Way Construction, General Construction and Site Work, located at 404 Coit Street, Irvington, NJ 07111 had additional heavy duty equipments and personnel to assist the Department of Public Works, and;

WHEREAS, this situation constitutes a threat to public health, safety, welfare, and the Acting Director of Neighborhood Services/Mayor of the Township of Irvington declared an Emergency and Your Way Construction, General Construction and Site Work, located at 404 Coit Street, Irvington, NJ 07111 had the necessary equipments available immediately to perform the work on an emergency basis, and;

WHEREAS, the total cost to rent the required equipments to complete the work was \$17,275.00 and;

WHEREAS, the Pay to Play documents are on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office and the Division of Purchasing.

McElroy – L.C. Jones 9. Authorized Investigation to Identify Parcels of Properties in Potential Foreclosure That May be Designated As Areas In Need of Redevelopment

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF IRVINGTON'S INVESTIGATION REGARDING WHETHER CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN THE TOWNSHIP SHOULD BE DESIGNATED AS AN AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, due in large part to the economic downturn of 2007 and certain predatory lending practices, many Township of Irvington home owners have experienced a significant decline in home values yet remain subject to underwater mortgages which have principal balances that exceed the current value of their home; and

WHEREAS, underwater mortgages are at significantly greater risk of going into foreclosure, with research showing that homeowners who are severely underwater on their mortgages are 150% to 200% more likely to default on their mortgages; and

WHEREAS, resetting mortgages on underwater homes to fair market value may reduce foreclosures and stabilize the real estate market to create revenue and jobs in our Township; and

WHEREAS, loans held in private-label securitization trusts (the “PLS Loans”) tend to be subject to pooling and servicing agreements that would require collective action by many security holders before the PLS Loans can be modified or sold out of trusts; and

WHEREAS, approximately one hundred ninety-nine (199) PLS Loans are located in the Township of Irvington (the “Township”); and

WHEREAS, conducting collective action across most holders of the PLS Loans has been historically difficult; and

WHEREAS, 78% of the PLS Loans located in the Township have some predatory feature in the terms of the original loan, including, but not limited to Adjustable Rate Mortgages, Balloon Mortgages, Interest Only Mortgages and Negative Amortizations; and

WHEREAS, the Township has an interest in reducing the number of foreclosures within the Township to keep families in their homes and preserve the community and tax base and the Township has a responsibility to promote policies that benefit the people who live and work in our Township; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public good and in the public interest for the Township to keep families in their homes and preserve the community and tax base; and

WHEREAS, none of the foreclosure prevention efforts that have been implemented thus far at the local, state, or federal levels have adequately addressed the crisis;

WHEREAS, cities and towns elsewhere in the country have considered implementing local programs to reset underwater mortgages by acquiring certain underwater mortgages for fair market value for the purpose of restructuring and modifying those loans by reducing the loan principal; and

WHEREAS, such programs may help prevent foreclosures and stabilize the housing market in communities where they are implemented; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to determine if it may utilize its powers of eminent domain to acquire, restructure and/or modify the PLS Loans located in the Township to help prevent foreclosures and stabilize the Township’s housing market; and

WHEREAS, the *Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq.* (the “LRHL”), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Township may utilizes its powers of eminent domain for the redevelopment of areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 40:12A-6* the Township Council of the Township of Irvington (the “Township Council”) must authorize the Planning Board of the Township of Irvington (the “Planning Board”) to conduct a preliminary investigation of the proposed area and make recommendations to the Township Council; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council desires to support the Township Administration initiative to identify whether various individual or contiguous sites within the Township may qualify as an “area in need of redevelopment” in accordance with *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5* and *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6* due to the status of certain PLS Loans which include underwater mortgages or mortgages subject to pre-foreclosure or foreclosure activities; and

WHEREAS, the Township Administration shall prepare a staff report (the “Staff Report”) identifying the parcels located throughout the Township to be studied to determine if they meet the criteria to be designated an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Staff Report shall further examine the extent to which underwater mortgages in the Township have lead to foreclosures, and the potential impact that such foreclosures have had on (i) increasing the municipal deficit, (ii) eroding the municipal tax base, (iii) placing an undue burden on Township property owners, (iv) causing homes to become dilapidated, obsolete and/or blighted, (v) forcing cuts to essential local services and jobs that support communities and/or (vi) otherwise negatively impacting the general welfare of the Township; and

WHEREAS, in connection with completing the Staff Report, the Township Administration shall conduct an investigation, prepare a map of the proposed area (the “Proposed Area”), and complete a public hearing at which comments to the designation shall be received and considered (collectively, the “Due Diligence Investigation”); and

WHEREAS, subject to the results of the Due Diligence Investigation, the Township Council shall consider directing the Planning Board to conduct an investigation in accordance with *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6* to determine whether the Proposed Area as identified in the Staff Report meets the criteria set forth in *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5* to be designated as an area in need of redevelopment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Municipal Council of the Township of Irvington as follows:

1. The recitals above are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.
2. The Township Administration is hereby authorized to conduct an investigation and prepare the Staff Report identifying the parcels located throughout the Township to be studied to determine if they meet the criteria to be designated an area in need of redevelopment.
3. As part of its investigation, the Township Administration shall prepare a map showing the boundaries and location of the proposed area, and shall append thereto a statement setting forth the basis for the investigation.
4. The Township Administration shall conduct a public hearing to hear from all persons who are interested in or would be affected by such determination.
5. After conducting its investigation, preparing a map of the boundaries and location of the proposed area, and completing a public hearing, the Township Administration shall make a recommendation to the Township Council as to whether the Township Council direct the Planning Board to conduct a formal investigation to designate all or some of the proposed area as an area in need of redevelopment.
6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
